INTRODUCTION

Towards the end of the 1970s, the world is at the height of the Cold War. Military dictatorships in Latin America are coordinated by an operation named Condor. Their objective: to jointly persecute their political enemies and to make them disappear. Although this is less known, the Peruvian and Argentine dictatorships closely collaborated, exchanging prisoners and exiles as needed.

Operation Condor chronicles Peru's role in one of the most sinister episodes in Latin American history. The theft and trafficking of children as a repressive measure. An exile in Peru from the Spanish Civil War who has already lived through this and is now facing the outbreak of fascism in this part of the world, decides to set himself up as a vigilante.

SYNOPSIS

The best Peruvian football team of all time debuts in the World Cup in Argentina '78. During the match, a man is killed in Lima. Félix Chacaltana, a diligent clerk at the Judiciary branch, is assigned the case because he is the only person who has no interest in the soccer game. Joaquin Calvo, his only friend, turns out to be the victim.

Félix begins an investigation that involves him in a political plot that reveals the alliance between the Peruvian and Argentine dictatorships. Peru loses by 6 to 0, allowing Argentina to reach the Final. Is it part of Condor Plan? Could it be that his friend and the state have broken the rules?

Gonzalo Calvo, a Spanish exile and Joaquin's father, will teach him that all is fair in war and that all wars are the same.

Félix loses his innocence; now he only needs to lose his virginity.

MICHEL GOMEZ - DIRECTOR (Marseille, 1959)

Michel Gomez is a French director and producer based in Peru since 1982. Peruanist, lover of its culture and scholar of its society. He has shot and produced more than forty national and international productions, including news features, miniseries,

films, short films, video clips, fictions for television. In addition, he has directed musical shows and plays among his many artistic activities. He revolutionized television fiction by making it inclusive, away from racist and alienating clichés.

He is known for "Todas las Sangres", "Los de arriba y los de abajo", "Senderos de violencia", "Sarita Colonia", "Tatán", "La Perricholi", "El caracol de Madagascar", among other productions.

He is currently preparing the book of photographs "La Mar en el Cielo" (The Sea in the Sky) and close to filming the feature film "Indeseable" (Undesirable).



CV SANTIAGO RONCAGLIOLO - SCREENWRITER (Lima, 1975)

Marked by Peruvian violence in the eighties, his novels study fear and evil, from everyday experiences to the history of Latin America. They have been published throughout Spain and Latin America and have been published in more than twenty languages, including English, French, Chinese and Arabic. His latest one is titled "Y libranos del mal".

He has also published the crime novels "La Pena Máxima" and "Abril Rojo" (Alfaguara Prize and Independent Prize of Foreign Fiction), the psychological thriller "Tan Cerca de la Vida" and the acidic comedies "Óscar y las Mujeres" and "Pudor", the latter filmed in Spain by brothers Tristán and David Ulloa.

As a screenwriter, he has developed projects for production companies such as Legendary in Los Angeles, Zeta and El Deseo in Spain, Tondero in Peru, Acere in Brazil and Fremantle in Mexico, working with directors such as Alejandro González Iñárritu or Everardo González. He has also adapted his novel "La Pena Máxima" to the cinema, and José Donoso's novel "El Jardín de al Lado" for the stage.

As a journalist, he is the author of a trilogy of true stories about the Hispanic twentieth century: "La Cuarta Espada", "El Amante Uruguayo" and "Memorias de una Dama", considered "the last censored book in Latin America". In addition, he has collected his chronicles on cinema and plays in "El Material de los Sueños". His columns and reports on cultural and humanitarian issues have appeared in El País of Spain, German Vogue, Vanity Fair in all its Hispanic editions, and Peru's El Comercio.



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
